

Official Work Party Safety Instructions and Considerations

Introduction

PSAC believe that the work to be undertaken by volunteers is important in assuring the future of our waters both rented and owned by the club, but its overriding priority is the safety and wellbeing of you and all others involved in the work. Work parties can be dangerous events if everyone is not aware of the hazards around them. You should be aware that actions you take may affect the safety of the people around you.

What Happens on the Day?

Unless told otherwise, Work parties on the main group, Carp and Roadside ponds meet at the club hut car park, Firemans meet at the Fireman's car park and Stork at the normal parking on the verge on Manor Road and or Talbot Avenue at **8am** on Sunday and **8:30am** on a Wednesday with meeting times for midweek work parties as advertised to allow for registration and instruction.

The club will have nominated a supervisor to lead the working party who may have others to assist them in specific tasks, this is especially so when the work party is large or spread out.

The supervisor and any assistants will allocate and explain the tasks to be undertaken, please listen to their instruction carefully and do not go beyond their brief unless you are given permission by the supervisor to do so.

Work is varied and can include:

- Trimming and removing bank side growth. With the occasional removal of large branches and shrubs.
- Clearing swims by removing weed/reeds from the water.
- Repairing and constructing swims
- Clearing paths and Car Parks
- Repairing and installing fencing.

Cancellation

Occasionally due to unforeseen circumstances work parties may need to be cancelled. Every effort will be made to let members know as soon as possible before the planned work party by posting on both, Facebook, and club website home page at <u>www.psac.co.uk</u> or email/push notification via the Clubmate Mobile App.

Health and Safety Key Points

- Health and safety is everyone's responsibility.
- Look after yourself and others, By the nature of the club's activities virtually all our work parties will be beside water. Water can kill Respect it!
- No one should go into the water unless it is absolutely essential to do so and then only with authorisation and wearing appropriate equipment including a life jacket.
- When working in the water or from a boat a dedicated support person must be on the bank, they should have a throwing line available for instant use.
- Mechanical equipment may only be used by those who are signed onto the club 'user register' which
 means that they will have received instruction from a competent person in its operational use and onsite maintenance of the equipment. The equipment normally provided by PSAC includes Grass Mowers,
 Strimmers, Brush Cutters, Chain Saws and Winches if you notice any defects in the equipment, please stop
 using it and report your concerns to the work party supervisor.
- When using mechanical equipment, the operator and the supervisor must ensure that the correct PPE (personal protection equipment) must be worn. This should include goggles or visor, gloves, ear protection and ideally a helmet. Anyone assisting or working alongside an operator using mechanical equipment should also be wearing a suitable level of PPE.
- When sharp tools are in use, great care should be taken.

- All tasks must be pre-planned, and all involved must understand the plan prior to work commencing.
- Consideration must always be given to manual handling, Back injuries are all too common, lifting and carrying needs thought and care. Do not lift beyond what you feel comfortable with and do not be afraid to ask for assistance when lifting.
- Trip and slip hazards (roots branches, brambles, and wet grass etc) can be present, take care.
- The club does not generally allow lone working however, if it becomes appropriate that a lone working task can be achieved safely and without risk it can be authorised on the day by the work party supervisor however a clear line of communication between the volunteer and the supervisor must be maintained, for instance the sharing of mobile phone numbers.

Your Personal Health & safety

When working around or near water if you have cuts or grazes these should be covered by an adequate waterproof dressing to avoid the danger of infection and in particular Weil's Disease.

Any member with a known medical condition that may affect the type of work you can do should bring it to the attention of the work party supervisor (they will treat it in confidence). Invariably there is 'lighter' work available at all work parties. No one expects you to work beyond your capabilities, take your time, work at a pace that suits you and take any breaks that you need. However, if you can contribute it will be greatly appreciated.

Juniors & Children attending Work Parties:

The club would not normally encourage the bringing of youngsters to work parties however, if you bring a youngster with you, you should recognise that youngsters will not normally have the knowledge or experience to recognise the hazards associated with work parties and often have no concept of the risks and dangers they pose. For that reason, if you bring a youngster, you will have sole responsibility for their safety and wellbeing and ensuring that they behave responsibly.

What do I Bring?

- Always bring work gloves and suitable footwear though the club will provide gloves where needed for specific roles.
- Work can be wet and dirty; you need to wear clothes to suit these conditions. It is usually best to wear layers if you get hot you can remove a layer.
- Stout waterproof footwear is essential.
- Bring something to drink (Non-alcoholic)

Equipment

The supervisor will have arranged for much equipment to be available; but it will be helpful if you could bring any additional equipment, such as: - Bow saws, Loppers, and spades etc.

Materials will be provided by the Club.

Finally.

Volunteering for work parties is an excellent opportunity to learn about club waters, meet fellow members and play and active part in the club's future by keeping our waters in tip top condition and providing safe and enjoyable fishing for all.
